## WINEMAKER'S SERIES 2007 SAUVIGNON BLANC

---



Sauvignon Blanc is found today all over the world but the Loire Valley in South-West France claim it as their indigenous grape. In the new world it is currently enjoying the most fame from the Marlborough region of New Zealand. It also thrives in the high desert climate and sandy soils of the Snake River Valley.

*Wine Description:* Our 2006 Sauvignon Blanc was finished dry. It has a wonderful nose with hints of pear and lemon notes. It has a full bodied mouth feel and great structure.

*Winemaker Notes:* Sauvignon Blanc might be the easiest wine that we make. If we pick it at perfect ripeness it seems to need no further assistance from the winemakers. It is given a cool fermentation in steel, filtered and bottled. Year after year it produces an elegant, non-grassy styled version of Sauvignon Blanc.
